## Third Annual Toy Workshop at Palomar College.

There has been always been a mutually beneficial partnership between the San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association and The Cabinet and Furniture Technology Department at Palomar College. Continuing this relationship our Toy Committee and the College have been holding a workshop to, (what else?) build toys.

This is the third year of an annual program, where for three Saturdays the students PAY to build toys. Can you beat that? This year they arrived on the first Saturday, November 3rd. to find workbenches labeled with the names of toys to be built by the team at that work center and the name of one of the seven team leaders from our toy committee. All of the special parts needed for that particular toy such as wheels, pegs, dowels and jigs, had been provided and were in place at each work center.

The students chose which team they would like to work in and following a brief lecture from Charlie Bierman on some of the unique differences in toy building they set about building batches of 30 or more toys under the direction of their team leader. If you have built toys at our workshops you know that all of the bugs have been eliminated from the instructions and the designs refined for production. Because of this everyone appreciated that their efforts were 100% productive. On two later Saturdays the drilling and sawing, sanding and assembling, gluing and finishing and painting continued until we finally had rows and rows of beautifully made and finished grasshoppers and circus seals, doll beds and cameras, helicopters and bumble bees, kid size stools and cell phones and puzzles, all gleaming in bright colors or natural wood finishes.

It was good fun to work together and to be doing something nice for little kids that do not have a lot to be happy about. SDFWA President Ed Gladney visited and expressed his appreciation to everyone on behalf of the SDFWA and the needy kids. Well, all good things come to an end. The teams finally set up a display of completed toys, chatted and took photos. We had agreed

that everyone would take home one toy for their own favorite small person and choosing which one was fun too. Then we packed up the toys, to be taken to our Pro Bono Chairman for delivery to agencies throughout the County. Of course we will be doing it all over again next year but we have set up a tough goal to beat.

# Ladder Back Rocking Chair

In this time of tragedy in New York City, I feel quite helpless, yet I need to do something to help those people who are suffering so much.

I teach a class in Windsor and Appalachian Ladder Back chair making at Palomar College and I want to donate a Ladder Back rocking chair to the New York City Fire Department. My desire is that the families of the injured fire fighters use this chair as they sit by their loved ones hospital bed. I request that the chair be retained by the Department and made available to any fire fighter's family when the fireman is injured in the line of duty.

I am donating the rocking chair in memory of all those fire fighters that lost their lives at the World Trade Center on 9/11/01 as they responded to the 911 calls for help. The title of this chair is appropriately "911". I want all the fire fighters (nation wide) to know that we all appreciate their sacrifices for us.

My name is Russ Filbeck. I live in San Diego, CA. I am retired from the United States Navy's Submarine Service, and a graduate of San Diego State University. I am an Associate Professor in the Cabinet and Furniture Technology Division at Palomar College located just north of San Diego in San Marcos, CA.

Each summer I travel from San Diego to Berea, Kentucky to harvest green (fresh cut) oak, walnut, maple and cherry as well as the hickory bark for weaving the seat. The green wood is necessary for the steam bending process used to make these Classic American chairs.

This cherry rocker incorporates steam-bent back legs and slats with bent lamination rockers. The slat pegs are made of rose wood and the seat is woven with the inner bark of the hickory tree. The finish is an oil finish, the oil sanded into the wood to create a sensuously smooth surface.

The laser engraving on the slats was donated by Keepsake Creators, San Marcos, CA. The packaging for the rocker was donated by San Diego Crating and Packing, Poway, CA. Shipping donated by Trans Group of San Diego, CA. Photography donated by Archie Breeden of Escondido, CA.

My hope is that the chair will comfort those who are suffering.
