Quoting Kenny from an article in Woodworker West, "We deal in abstract realism, creating fantasy. We are professional counterfeiters. You have to a master of all talents, everything from a cabinetmaker to a bricklayer. One day you are making fine furniture, next day a rock. Most of what we create will be trashed after production completes the picture. However my furniture is more enduring. It often can be found in some movie executive's living room, after the production is complete." This promises to be an inside look at a unique area of woodworking seldom seen by most woodworkers.

### THE FOLLOWING ITEM IS OUT OF WOODWORKER WEST:

Last year, I wrote a letter nominating the **Woodworkers United for America** for the *Minwax Community Craftsman Award*. This annual competition attempts to recognize woodworkers who have been beneficial to their community through the use of their woodworking skills.

It was amazing how word of mouth (or word of Internet) produced a network of woodworkers from across the country - professionals to cub scouts – who volunteered to construct flag display cases for those who perished In the attacks of September 11,2001. I thought that there was no better way for our *woodworking* community to help the families of the deceased and the greater national community in this period of mourning.

This past Fall, I received a call from a Minwax representative. After thanking me for my nomination, they informed me that WUFA had finished as *First Runner-Up*, losing out to a woodworking club in Virginia that made *Toys for Tots*. I, do not know the details of the activities of this Virginia club, and I am sure it is undertaking a very worthy effort. However, more than half the clubs in this country are making toys for neglected and sick children. This effort by WUFA is a unique and, hopefully, a once- in-a-lifetime experience, emerging on its own as a natural expression of national solidarity. Moreover, this would have been a prefect public relations vehicle to promote the craft, besides bringing significant attention to Minwax.

Subsequently, WUFA has declined the runner-up prize of a supply of Minwax products. It's hope was to win the \$5,000 cash grant to help offset some costs of shipping cases to the East Coast.

WUFA is clearly the *Woodworking Organization of the Year*, and I urge anyone so inclined to visit its web *site-www.woodworkersunitedforamerica.org-and* make a contribution to support this truly honorable effort.
