This month's presenter, Bob Stevenson, will discuss some of the finer points on completing your masterpiece and show many of the simple things one can do to make a common, everyday project become a competitive work of art.

In addition several past winners of the Design in Wood Exhibition will bring in their winning pieces for you to look at up close and ask questions about.

Before becoming the Design in Wood Exhibition Coordinator in 1996, Bob won two Special Awards as a Palomar student and then became an annual Blue Ribbon winner in Design in Wood from 1987 to 1995. Now he concentrates on his custom furniture business and supervising the Design in Wood Exhibition.

The Design In Wood show entry form is now available at our sponsors and also posted on the web site. There are 21 categories with a total of \$16,500 in cash awards. Awards for each category are \$200 for first, \$175 for second, \$150 for third and \$75 plus a two-year subscription to Woodworkers Journal for fourth place. In addition SDFWA members are eligible for two additional categories, Amateur and Professional, with \$250 for first, \$150 for second and \$100 for third place in each category. These categories were added last year to increase the number of awards for members. So get to work on those entries.

The Design In Wood show requires lots of help from our members. We need your help for set up, tear down and also during the show. The biggest job is set-up and we need lots of help. The more help the better. No experience is necessary, just show up at the fair grounds and we can put you to work. Bring a screw gun if you have one but it is not necessary. We even supply donuts and coffee and pizza for lunch. Look for details in the newsletter. We also need volunteers to work in the 18th century cabinet shop making children's chairs. Each year we produce about 50 chairs for charity. These are hand made during the fair by our members. It is a great way to learn and practice hand tool techniques. If you want to learn how they did it in the old days sign up and we will teach you some new methods. We also need volunteers to work the floor during the show. Sign up sheets for all shifts will be available at the general meeting. All volunteers receive fair tickets. The more you volunteer, the more tickets you get. Work a few shifts and treat your family. Besides being a lot of fun it is a good way to get to know your fellow members. This is our big event for the year so sign up and plan to help.

Thanks to everyone for their donation to the WUFA effort. We collected over \$400 at last month's meeting and the association made up the rest to make it an even \$500.

We have several new committee chairpersons. Our new publicity chairman, Tom Henderson, reports that our general meetings will now be announced in the Sunday Tribune. Our new Special Events chair, Joe Madziarczyk, is planning the spring bus tour and fall seminar. Spring Bus Tour May 3, 2003

Huntington Museum Fullerton Museum

This year the SDFW Association is sponsoring a bus tour to the Huntington Museum in San Marino, California and the Fullerton Museum in Fullerton California.

The Huntington is an oasis of art and culture set amidst 150 acres of breathtaking gardens. Three art galleries and a library showcase magnificent collections of paintings, sculptures, rare books, manuscripts, and decorative arts. The botanical collection features over 14,000 different species of plants.

In addition to special exhibitions, the Scott Gallery includes a permanent installation of works by the early 20th-century Southern California architects, Charles and Henry Greene, as well as other Arts and Crafts objects, organized in collaboration with the Gamble

House (USC).



The chronological arrangement of the Scott Gallery's permanent collection traces the development of American art over three centuries. Period furniture and silver provide a domestic context for the paintings and sculpture. Visitors enter a display of art from the colonial period and the first years of the republic, and continue through groupings of works from the antebellum period, the post-Civil War era, and the late 19th and early 20th centuries. In the central gallery, monumental paintings from the 18th and 19th centuries are complemented by furniture, silver, and sculpture.

The Fullerton features Crafting Utopia: The Art of Shaker Women





The Shakers were widely known in the 19th century as America's largest and most successful communal, religious, utopian sect. They lived in 24 large communities throughout the northeastern United States from the late 18th century until the mid-20th century. At their peak there were 4,000 to 6,000 members. Today, fewer than a dozen Shakers remain.

Crafting Utopia originates from the collection of the Hancock Shaker Village in Pittsfield, Massachusetts, a living history museum of Shaker life, crafts and farming. This exhibition comprises 115 beautifully crafted objects, including unique wooden ware and household objects, costumes and textiles, furnishings and graphics for Shaker products — the objects used in daily life that defined the collective chores assigned to the women in the community. This exhibition reveals the influence that women exercised in the development of the Shakers.

A traveling exhibition organized by International Arts & Artists, Inc., Washington DC, from the collection of the Hancock Shaker Village, Pittsfield, Massachusetts.

Tickets: The cost is \$40 per person, which includes transportation, admissions costs for both Museums, lunch and gratuities. Tickets will go on sale at the March 26th meeting at 6:15PM on a first come first served basis and will be sold through the end of the April 23rd meeting. We expect this tour to sell out. Checks made to SDFWA preferred.


Shop Tip

Pencil Keeps Miter Gauge Sliding

The other day the miter gauge in my table saw was sticking in the slot, and for the life of me I couldn't find a can of dry lubricant. So I improvised with something I always have

close at hand, the pencil in my apron pocket.

After blowing out the sawdust, I simply "scribbled" on the sides and bottom of the miter gauge slot with the pencil. The graphite made things slide freely again.
