Cabinet Making and Construction Techniques





Andy Rae is a furniture designer, craftsman, teacher, and author of two videos and countless articles for various publications, including American Woodworker and Fine Woodworking magazines. Andy apprenticed with George Nakashima and Frank Klausz then went on to become a Senior Editor for American Woodworker Magazine for six years. He is author of Furniture and Cabinet Construction published by Taunton Press last year (Part of the three book series of which Gary Rogowski's tome we provided at the seminar last year). He authored Choosing and Using Hand Tools in 2002. In 1990 he received a Fellowship grant from the New Jersey Council for the Arts and today is a leading designer and furniture maker on the East Coast. A frequent guest speaker and lecturer, Andy just completed teaching a five-day class in cabinetmaking at Marc Adams School of Woodworking in Franklin, IN. Andy is currently working on a book about rustic furniture making, gathering inspiration from his surroundings in the wild and wooded Smoky Mountains of western North Carolina.

The seminar will focus on Cabinetmaking using solid wood and panel stock (MDF and Plywood). Both construction techniques (European 32mm and Face Frame) will be presented.

Getting to Know the Directors and Committee Heads of SDFWA

Featured in this issue, The head of Refreshments, Harry Feucht

Harry's interest in woodworking started at the young age of seven or eight while watching his father build things around the house. During that same time period Harry's father was taking adult education classes in woodworking and took Harry to class with him. Throughout these formative years you could find young Harry building model ships and planes as a precursor of things to come in future.

Harry had a couple of influential shop teachers that helped formulate his love for woodworking. One being Mr. Warick, prior to the seventh grade and his seventh and eight-grade shop teacher Mr. Shay. Harry's most memorable project in his shop classes was a lead casting of Lincoln's head and attaching it to a walnut plank. There were no woodworking classes in Harry's agenda while he attended high school.

After high school Harry joined the Navy in the middle of WWII and after serving two years was discharged.

Taking advantage of the educational benefits available to veterans Harry attended Buffalo State Collage in New York State, graduating with a BA degree in Industrial Arts. Upon obtaining a job, Harry taught seventh and eight grade general shop, until the school where he worked, opened a wood shop and then he took on the responsibility and job of teaching the love of wood and woodworking to young students.

While serving the community as a teacher, Harry still had the desire to serve to his country. He joined The National Guard as a Second Lieutenant, Medical Service Officer, eventually working his way up the ranks, retiring as a Major. In 1983 Harry retired from The National Guard and teaching.

With free time on his hands, Harry did remodeling, built toys and furniture.

Harry lived in the San Francisco Bay area and belonged to a local woodworking association. When he relocated to San Diego, he sought out the SDFWA and joined in November of 1985.

In 1986 he participated in the setup and helped run the Design in Wood Show. He has worked every show since then. Harry currently is assistant coordinator of the Design in Wood Show. His responsibilities include scheduling and coordination of the staff, timekeeping, opening every day and insuring that the day-to-day operations run smoothly.

In 1988 Harry became the committee head of the Refreshment Committee.
