On Saturday December 13 at 9:00am we will have a tour of Paul Henry's recently renovated shop, located at 2633 State St. (rear), Carlsbad, Ca. 92008. Shop phone is 760-434-4270. There is adequate parking in the Carlsbad Village Coaster Station parking lot. Paul's shop is the red building adjacent to the north end of that parking lot.

Paul is a self-taught furniture maker who opened his first workshop in 1976 near Boston's South Station. In 1981, he moved to Carlsbad and began to specialize in antique restoration and moving damage repair, as well as custom furniture. Paul's current work is based upon traditional forms, and can be seen at the David Zapf Gallery, 2600 Kettner Blvd., San Diego as well as Trios Gallery, 130 S. Cedros, Solana Beach. Paul is an instructor of furniture design at Palomar College.

Paul's shop is 1150 square feet, crammed with tools, but with the flexibility to accommodate many different types of work. Paul will explain the layout and planning of the recent redesign of the space, and have current work-in-progress on hand.
