

#### Model Building by Bob Crawford.

### Shop Tour - Duane Anderson's Home Shop

On Saturday April 10, 2004, at 9am we will have a shop tour of Duane Andersons shop in Escondido. (Shop phone: 760 480-1014).

Duane's shop is currently being used to craft windows and workbenches for the fire-damaged studio of artist/architect James Hubbell in Santa Ysabel. Duane, Chuck Meacham and Ray McNamara are doing the work, which uses rough-sawn cedar lumber salvaged from the "Pines" fire of 2002.

Duane's background has been the restoration and repair of antique spinning wheels and crafting new spinning wheels of his own design as a hobby while in Minnesota. In California he has been building class-room furniture and millwork for windows for the James Hubbell-designed school in Tijuana which is operated by the Americas Foundation.

Another recent project has been (with the help of Randy Morrow) the restoration of a 70-year-old farmhouse on a hilltop adjacent to his home property.

Duane's shop consists of two table saws, a 13" planer, a Performax drum sander, two metal lathes, a milling machine plus the usual bandsaw, sanders and assorted other equipment.

### March Membership Report

As of 5 March we have 1078 members enrolled. Of the 1655 members on 31 December 2003, 973 (58.8%) have renewed and 105 new members have joined for this year. Spousal member cards have been issued to 389 (36%) and 220 (20%) of the members have opted for the website as their newsletter source. The renewal rate is the same as last year at this time although, on a larger base, a greater number have renewed. Although new membership at this time is down, the total of 1078 is 6 more than on 5 March 2003.

As is usual at this time of year, despite notices in the November 2003 and January 2004 newsletters, we have had to mail 671 reminder letters to unrenewed members. Printing of the letters and envelopes (sending and return) and the mail preparation and postage costs about \$400. Membership applications are processed on the day received in our P.O. Box and new cards are mailed out the same day or the next morning.

I have received a number of phone calls and emails from "members" who discovered that they couldn't get a discount at one of our resource firms because their membership wasn't current. Don't get in this situation; **renew.**

### Members help fire victim cleanup with a workparty near Julian

It wasn't, the way any of us would have liked to spend the day, especially our host, SDFWA Toy Chairman Roger Solheid. There we were, an even dozen of us, on Saturday February 28th, on a mountaintop a few miles from Julian, stuffing the remains of Roger's beautiful vacation home and workshop into a dumpster. Wheelbarrow after wheelbarrow of mostly unrecognizable melted metal was loaded, pushed and dumped by willing volunteers, and a few big things like a log splitter, a pot-bellied stove, a bathtub or a propane tank were carried or rolled end-over-end by as many as it took to do the job.

Peter Tobias and Odie Brand set the pace. It was chilly, and remnants of a recent snowstorm were still on the ground, but it didn't take twelve hard working guys very long to work up a sweat and shed their heavy jackets. Harry Feucht kept the coffee and donuts coming all morning, and the sandwiches for lunch. But the dominant and most difficult problem was a VERY large water tank the fire had rendered unusable. The corrugated monster was eight feet around and fifteen feet tall until it met its masters, who pulled it over and chopped it into dumpster-sized pieces. Sawzall masters Chuck Luebbers, Jerry Blakeley. John Van Blerck and Roger himself turned the Big One into manageable pieces, with Gene Stlinter and Don Summers taking their turns with saw and sledge hammer and generator management.

It looked like the construction dumpster was full to the gunnels and at its capacity until Jack Thurman climbed in to organize and rearrange the rubble and guide the rest of the team lifting and pulling and shoving heavy chunks of corrugated iron up and into the dumpster. It was hard to believe it all fit. All in all it was a gratifying day for all of us to be able to pull together to help our friend and fellow Association member.

Roger hasn't decided if or when he might build anew. It will take years for the beautiful trees to renew and years to recover emotionally from the loss of a home that was created over a quarter of a century. We were glad to be there with hands and hearts and tools and now we are standing by to help John and Sharon Pierce and Ron Gatewood who also suffered extensive fire damage.
