From the President...

The Design In Wood entry forms are at our sponsors and also available on-line at http://www.sdfair.com/pdf/wood04.pdf. I hope you are working on your entries. Entry forms must be received before April 30 but you may also enter on-line at the above address. We have two categories of awards reserved for SDFWA members. First, second and third place awards for amateur and professional categories. Amateur class is reserved for members who have not previously won a ribbon and professional class is for members who have previously won. These awards are additional awards reserved for SDFWA members and are in addition to the awards available to all entries.

We still need volunteers for setup, teardown, working the floor and the chair shop. Sign-up sheets will be available at the meeting. There are plenty of positions available and we need your help. Building children's chairs in the 19th Century cabinet shop is a great way to polish up your hand tool skills, learn new techniques, or just conversing with the crowds. We also need volunteers for the floor to watch over the exhibits.

Floor duty can be rewarding answering the many questions about the pieces on display. Answers on all the pieces are available so you don't have to be an expert. It also gives you a chance to spend some time really looking over the different works on display.

There are usually over 300 entries and I know from experience that I seem to find something new each time I go through the show. Finally, we always need your help for setup and tear down.

No sign up necessary for this. Just show up. No skill needed. If you have a screw gun, bring it. We will even feed you coffee and donuts in the morning and also provide lunch. Our meeting this month features Bob Stevenson. Bob builds American period reproductions using the same techniques as the master furniture makers of the 17th and 18th century. He uses the same tools having inherited his great-uncle's tools from the period. His work has been published in many magazines and articles and has been featured in Fine Woodworking magazine. Bob will tell us how to make a great looking oil finish.

Shop Tour - Beaudrys Woodcraft

On Saturday May 8th, 2004, at 9am we will have a shop tour of Jerry Beaudry's home shop located at 11027 Dutton Drive (Shop phone: 619-444-1577). Free parking is available on the street. There is a driveway/ingress/egress leading to the shop and it is important not to block the neighbor's access.

Originally from Chicago, Jerry has lived in San Diego since 1979. In his early years, he would assist his father with his many woodworking projects, both at their home and at their rustic summer cabin in South Haven, Michigan. His love of woodworking has continued over the years, in various applications. From 1986 to 1995, he applied his knowledge of woodworking to become a Shipwright. One of his many accomplishments was the complete museum renovation of a 1926 Monterey Trawler. As a general contractor, Jerry's passion for wood was always evident in his work, from the delicate architectural intricacies of fireplace mantels, to custom kitchens, baths, home offices and built-in furniture.

After discovering the Cabinet and Furniture Technology Department at Palomar College, he immediately enrolled in classes and further developed his craft and love for design. Jerry has been greatly influenced by the true masters – Nakashima and Maloof, with whom he has had the privilege of personally meeting and working. The basic design elements of Mandarin, Shaker, and Arts and Crafts styles are also influential in Jerry's original creations.

Having come full circle, he now teaches his craft at Palomar College. Jerry is currently the Vice President of the PROFESSIONAL CABINET AND FURNITURE MAKERS GUILD OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, an organization that he was instrumental in founding at Palomar College. Other affiliations include membership in the Woodworkers Society of America, the San Diego Fine Woodworkers' Association, and President of the San Diego Chapter of the Pontiac Oakland Club International.

They will need to submit digital images and use a credit card to complete the online electronic entry.

This year we have a big job to set-up because of some new display cases we have constructed. However, once we complete set-up for this year, next year's set-up will take half the time and be so much easier.

The new display cases still need to have some final assembly. Next year we will be able to just wheel them in, open them up, and plug them in – no real assembly required. My ultimate goal is to have the entire evolution of set-up take only a couple of days.

Set-up this year starts during the week before Memorial Day. Tuesday, May 25, we will start our set-up at 8:30am and continue all week through the weekend. If you can help, just show up. Screw guns to drive Phillips-head screws and a couple of ladders are always helpful. We take care of coffee, donuts, refreshments, lunch, and cold drinks. You will also get some tickets to the Fair for helping with the set-up.

Entries for this year's competition close on April 30, 2004, at 5:00pm.

Entries will be delivered on Thursday, June 3, 2004, and judged on June 5, 2004. The Fair opens on June 11, 2004 with the award ceremony that evening starting at 7:00pm.

Another way you can get free tickets is to sign up for the Children's Chair Shop or the Gallery floor. Every shift you sign up for, you get two (2) tickets. For now, I am the sole editor of this column and I will not be held accountable for any messed up projects resulting from these hints. So, with that in mind, here are a few tips and techniques. For the next newsletter (and to keep some focus) send me your favorite tips and techniques for the router. This could be a jig, or a way to set up the router, or clever ways to store bits or just about anything to do with the router.

Use those plastic hangers that have the clothespin like clips for hanging your shop drawings while working on your project. Use as a regular hanger or cut off the hook and screw the body to the wall. It keeps the plans handy and off the workbench. Submitted by Dale Stauffer

A handy wooden jig for tightening the Porter Cable 690 Router bolt. (He will bring it to the meeting) Submitted by Bob Coates

Punch about 8 holes in the rim of a can of finish so the excess can drain back into the can. Then make a mark on the lid and front of the can so you can always put the lid back in the same place, insuring a good clean, tight fit. Submitted by Chuck Anderson

When working with finishes that cure with exposure to air, such as tung oil, I fill the can with marbles to hold the amount of air in the can to a minimum. Submitted by Doug Parker.

When using latex or rubber gloves it always a pain to get them on the second or third time. Just blow them up like a balloon to pop out the fingers and they easily slip on. Submitted by Anonymous.
