Judging the pieces for the SDFWA member awards was particularly difficult this year. Your craftsmanship gets better each year and it shows. We also awarded eight \$400 scholarships during the fair. Four scholarships went to college students and four to high school woodworkers.

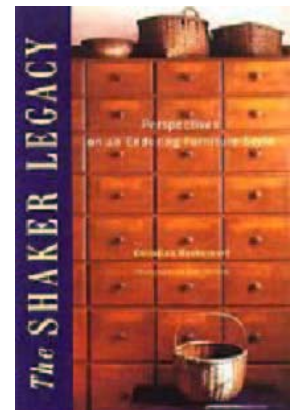

Now that the chairs are together, cleaned up and leveled--final sanding and oil finishing remain to be done. I will have complete instructions and the chairs at this meeting. We really need many people to take a couple of chairs home, sand and finish, and return them at the September meeting. So don't be bashful! Everyone in the Association can do the finishing--so take them off my hands for a while and then the charities that asked for chairs can get them.

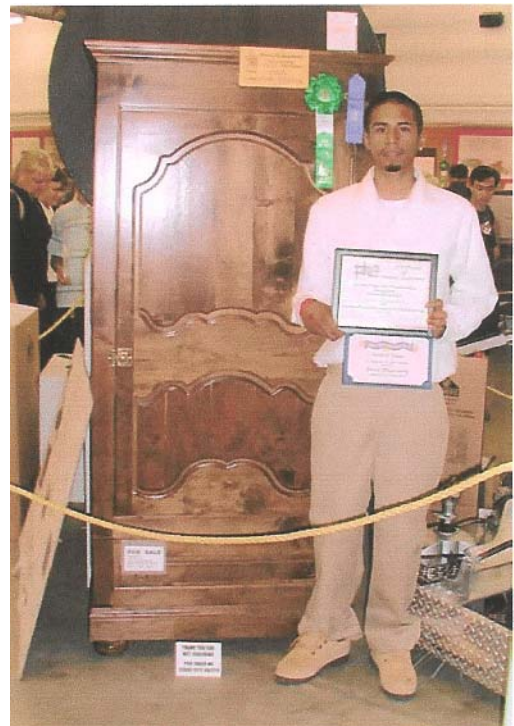
