### Construction of Wooden Fishing Rods and Reels By John H. Elder

As we wind down from the flurry of activity of the *Designs in Wood Exhibition* at the 2006 San Diego County Fair there is an opportunity to reflect on the many beautiful pieces that were in the competition this year. I never come away from the Exhibition feeling disappointed with what I have seen. All of the pieces show excellence in craftsmanship and creativity and I imagine it is extremely difficult for the judges to make their final decisions. I am always inspired by the beautiful work that I see.

One piece particularly worthy of its first place award in the category Models, Not to Scale was John Elder's Pflueger Progress Skeleton-type Fly Reel. The reel has all the characteristics of the original reel, including a working clicker and reel that spins freely in its housing. John has an amazing ability to make one type of wood look like another. For example, the handle on this fly rod is actually poplar made to look like cork. He creates threaded rods and nuts in wood to hold his reels to the rods and they work just like the real thing. Another unique quality of John's work is the creative display of his reels by creating stands that give the illusion the rod is in use and just waiting for a fish to bite.

John is a Professor of Molecular Biology at The Scripps Research Institute in La Jolla. He has been involved in woodworking for over 30 years, starting with survival woodworking (refinishing/furniture restoration) during college. Most of his woodworking projects are related to his other hobbies including golf putters, tackle boxes, display cabinets, wood fishing lures and the rods and reels. He has been a regular participant in the Designs in Wood Exhibitions for many years and has received numerous awards for his fine craftsmanship.

The presentation for this month's meeting will be a PowerPoint presentation that covers how John designs and builds his rods and reels including how he creates the various intricate pieces that make up his models. He uses common equipment found in most wood shops and has a practical, problem solving approach to creating these beautiful works of art. John will also bring some of the rods and reels he has built for display at the meeting. Please join us for what promises to be an interesting and information packed presentation. See you at the meeting!!

### **GOING BEYOND THE CALL OF DUTY**

This year's "Design In wood" exhibit was a celebration of 25 years of excellence. The success of this show is the result of the hard work and dedication of hundreds of SDFWA members over these many years. In this article I will feature two of our members who have gone beyond the call of duty. One has been in the spotlight all these years, while the other has worked behind the scenes.

Del Cover is the only person who has entered pieces consecutively in the Design In wood Exhibition for the past 25 years. His work has met the exhibit founders objectives. They have been very original and superbly crafted. His 1982 entry was the much talked about Breast of Drawers. In 1983 his piece, Dragon Hammock made the cover of Fine Woodworking Magazine. This years entry was made from left over pieces he collected over these many years.

Del has competed and won awards in the classes of contemporary, traditional, art furniture, models and in the category made for children. Each year his pieces have both entertained and inspired the shows visitors. Besides his woodworking contributions, Del has also served the association for the past 12 years as Program Chairman., which has helped educate us all. When Del is not serving SDFWA, he makes a living as a professional woodworker. His specialties are chair building and matching styles.

He became internationally known through a collaboration with the late Niki de St. Phalle. Two of their projects are: the Chariot in Tarot Garden in Italy and the Niki Snake Chairs for the Jean Tinguely Museum restaurant in Basil,

Switzerland. A current challenge has been building a couch and chair designed by James Hubbell to replace the ones burned in the Cedar fire. Del has enjoyed the competition and fellowship with many of our members over the past quarter century.

Over the years Harry Baldwin has helped set up the exhibit, worked in the chair shop, and helped with photographing the winning entries. This last activity has allowed him the opportunity to see each piece inside and out.

Harry was one of the original members who sign up for the association at the Cutting Edge. He volunteered to produce the mailing labels for the newsletter. At the time he did the work on a pre-IBM home computer and printed them on a noisy (now obsolete) "daisy wheel" printer. Harry is still involved with the membership list, some twenty five years later. Over these many years he has worked with Ray McNamara, George Helsten, Paul Jones, and Len Wener. Harry feels that his association with this organization and many of the members has contributed something very positive in his life.

Bicycle touring is a favorite pass time of Harry's. One of his trips was inspired by a fellow member, Lorenzo Foncerrada, who gave a talk at one of the general meetings about his trip to Bali and the many wood carvers. Harry has since toured New Zealand, and South America, where he saw many exotic woods and the interesting objects made from them. A dream trip of his is to tour Costa Rica and examine his 200 hardwood trees made up of sixteen different species. Harry also flies a glider competitively.

Both of these individuals have had a positive affect on my life and I am sure many others. Thank you both for setting your own standards of excellence.



### Design in Wood 2006

The 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Design in Wood Exhibition has been put to bed after a successful three weeks and over 1.2 million visitors many of whom actually came just to see our exhibit. Over the years we have created quite a following. In addition to local regulars, we have some folks who come from places like MO, MI, AZ, OR, WA, and MD just to see Design in Wood and have done so for several years.

It is real rewarding to hear the nice comments regarding the pieces and the display. Countless times I heard, "This is the only reason I come to the Fair."

This year setup went very well with plenty of volunteers. The signups for the chair shop and the volunteers to walk the floor of the exhibit was at about 80%. Remember next year, this is your show and we need your support. If everyone signed up for one shift we would have more than enough help. Why is it always left to the other guy? If you are a member of an organization, it seems only reasonable that you would want to take part and give back rather then just take.

This year, as in the past, we had one day after the Fair ended on July 4<sup>th</sup> to take the exhibit down and have it ready to load on the three semi trailers the next morning. We started at 8:00am on July 5 with 10 staff, 4 volunteers from SDFWA, 2 Scrollers, 4 Turners, 4 Maritime Museum members, and 2 Carvers. At 9:00am we hired 8 U.S. Marine volunteers to help. With a couple of exceptions, most of the other guilds had their booths down and stowed and the personnel left just about lunch time or shortly thereafter. The Marines had to leave at 3:00pm. This left 10 of us there to finish packing out and giving back the entries. We left at 8:00pm that evening not guite done and totally exhausted.

The next morning 4 staff and one volunteer wrapped up and the trucks were loaded by 12:00 noon.
