November Program

The MicroFence System for Routers

Hello All,

This is the last meeting for 2006 and we have a wonderful presentation for you this month. You know, a router is just about the most versatile tool in the woodworking shop. I can do more with a router than just about any other tool. The number and types of accessories for routers are virtually endless. One in particular that I have been intrigued by for many years is the MicroFence System. I got to know Richard Wedler, the inventor and owner of Micro Fence System for Routers and am honored to introduce him as our invited speaker for the meeting this month.

Richard has been a custom cabinet and furniture maker in Southern California for over thirty years. He wasn't always a professional woodworker and his life experience is broad and interesting. After completing college, participating in the family business and touring the US as a singer and guitarist performing the opening concerts for some well known acts that included Judy Collins, Josh White, Tom Rush and a good many others, Richard eventually landed in Los Angeles and was involved for several years in making documentary films which have reaped a number of awards on the festival circuit.

All the while, between paying music and film gigs, his woodworking skills kept the cash flowing, (or trickling). Eventually, the woodworking led to a growing business in furniture making. Throughout the seventies and eighties he worked for, and with, some of the most prestigious design firms and architects in the city, building pieces for the rich and famous of Hollywood. He still does commissions for a few clients when time permits.

In the late eighties, working with his machinist father, Rich conceived of and built the first Micro Fence Edge-Guide in response to a frustration he was experiencing with router operations. The concept was to develop a means of measurement that would improve the accuracy and efficiency of set-ups on the hand-held router. Rich and his Dad. Jack Wedler, worked on prototypes for several years before deciding to make and market the Micro Fence. Though Jack passed away in '98, Rich has continued on with the development of the rest of the System that continues to evolve todav.

Richard will talk about the development of the MicroFence System for Routers and will demonstrate the system he and his father invented. The versatility, extreme accuracy, ease of use and practicality of his system will provide an educational and interesting evening of router use magic. Please join us!

A Year of Refection and Growth

This past year of working on our 25th anniversary has been very rewarding for me. It has allowed me to renew old friendships and to learn about the production of DVD's. In this article, I will write about the Toy Program, our second community service.

In May of 1985, I introduced the idea of having a toy building program as a community service that would utilize the woodworking skills of those members who did not have the time or skills to build a fine show quality piece. That first year a few individuals made over one hundred toys that were given to three charities in San Diego.

One type of toy I built that year was a cradle/bed, which is still being made by the group today. I bought this uniquely designed bed from a 95 year old gentleman who lived in Port Orange, Florida, his name Roaman Jacinski. Roman had retired from the laundry business and started a small wooden crafts shop. He was still making sawdust into his 100's. The sparkle in his eye and his love for working with wood was quite an inspiration to me.

A few weeks ago, I experienced a similar excitement about woodworking when I visited Charlie Bierman at his shop. I was very impressed by Charlie's enthusiasm and his pride he showed for the toy program. All the people who are involved with this project have made it into a smooth running and self-sufficient operation. There are networks for obtaining wood and other supplies. High quality and precision engineered jigs to aid in the mass production of many of the toys have been made by the group.

Each year this fine program makes between 3 to 4 thousand wooden toys plus chairs and tables. These items are given to needy children and their supporting organizations throughout the county. Recipients include health clinics, child care centers, and pre-school operations. Besides helping the community at large, the toy program also benefits our members.

The program gives satisfaction to those making the toys for the children. The group workshops offer members a chance for fellowship and sharing of knowledge. These workshops also allow those members who are starting out in woodworking and lack skills or equipment to learn and enjoy woodworking. Some of the members of the toy program teach a toy making class at Palomar Community College each year.

My hat goes off to Roger Solheid, Charles Pinkus, Charlie Bierman, and all of you who are involved with the toy making program – keep up this wonderful love you share with thousands of children each year.

Post Script: Lynn Rybarczyk heard that Art Carpenter died this year. Art was our first special guest seminar speaker. Lynn said that a conversation with Art in 1980 helped plant the seed for the Design In Wood Show at the San Diego County Fair.

(They both demonstrate the passion and volunteerism attitude of the SDFWA; my "hats off" to both of them!).

I wish to personally thank the SDFWA for providing my dad with the tremendous opportunity to participate with a great group of people who are dedicated to woodworking. He was very proud to be a member the SDFWA and my heartfelt thank you, along with my family, to this terrific organization.
