### "From Forest to Dining Room"

For the April meeting Bob Stevenson will give a power point presentation on greenwood working in the creation of Windsor chairs.

Many of us know about Bob's tireless work in the San Diego Fair's Design in Wood Exhibition. His effort, along with many of the club member volunteers, has created one of the largest and finest displays of woodworking in the United States. Many people attend the fair just to see the incredible pieces displayed in this exhibition and to watch the chair building demonstrations that go on through the entire fair.

Bob's discussion will include harvesting the trees in New England, methods of preparing and using the green wood to make chair parts, and the benefits of these particular methods of woodworking. He will end the presentation with a demonstration on the assembly process of the bow and spindles of a Brace back Bow Windsor side chair. The tools Bob uses are the same ones used in our 19<sup>th</sup> Century chair shop at the Fair. We hope you will join us for a very educational and information packed evening.

There is nowhere else on the planet that such an array and variety of fine woodworking is on display in one exhibit. We have 21 different categories with about 300 entries every year. Tell your friends and co-workers about the show and encourage them to attend. It is truly one of the great advantages we enjoy here in San Diego. Design In Wood entry forms are available at our sponsors and also on-line at

<u>http://www.sdfair.com/fair/pdf/entry\_wood.pdf</u>. Entry forms must be received by 5 PM, April 29. Six awards are reserved for SDFWA members. First, second and third place awards for Novice and Professional categories. The Novice class is reserved for members who have not previously won a ribbon and the Professional class is for members who have previously won. These are awards available only to SDFWA members and are in addition to the awards available to all entrants. I encourage you to enter. It can always be something you made a long time ago and have sitting around gathering dust. Enter it and get some recognition.

We still need volunteers for working the floor and the chair shop. Sign-up sheets will be available at the meeting and on line at <u>http://www.SDFWA.org</u>. There are plenty of positions available and we need your help. Building children's chairs in the 19th Century cabinet shop is a great way to polish up your hand tool skills or learn new techniques. Conversing with the crowds is always fun. We also need volunteers for the floor to watch over the exhibits. Floor duty is also rewarding. People always have questions about the show. We supply you with information on all the pieces and you don't have to be an expert. It also gives you a chance to spend some time really looking over the different works on display. There are usually over 300 entries and I know from experience that I seem to find something new each time I go through the show.

**SETUP STARTS MONDAY MAY 27 AT 8 AM**. We need your help for setup and tear down. No sign up necessary for this. Just show up. No skill needed. If you have a screw gun, bring it. We will even feed you coffee and donuts in the morning and also provide lunch. And you get fair tickets for your effort. It is always a lot of fun and a good way to meet a lot of your fellow woodworkers. Times and dates are provided in Bob Stevenson's article on the Design in Wood Show.

Speaking of volunteers, this organization runs totally on volunteer help. Besides the five elected board members we have 27 different committees. This requires a lot of help from a lot of dedicated people to make this organization function. We are always looking for volunteers. ### Videos by Next Seminar Speaker to Be Shown

One of the major objectives of the San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association is to help members increase their level of expertise. As part of this effort, a video library was established some years ago.
