Segmented Bowl Turning: The Big and the Small of It

Presented by Dan Leaf

WOW! Did you see that incredible Segmented Vase, last year at the Design in Wood Show. It was 3 feet in diameter, three and a half feet tall and contained over 3300 individual pieces. That was the work of Dan Leaf. He won numerous awards including First Place in that class of turning, The People's Choice Award and the Master Woodworker's trophy.

Dan started turning in high school shop class. He was drawn to the lathe because it was the one tool in the shop that wasn't being used. He has spent time with the late Ray Allen, a well known woodworker who created large segmented bowls and vases.

Dan doesn't turn only huge pieces. He also designs and builds smaller table top vases and bowls. The techniques for gigantic and standard sizes have some similarities, but there are differences.

Dan has put together a wonderful presentation with step by step photos on how he created that masterpiece titles "For Ray-3315 Pieces". He will also discuss and show how he does smaller pieces as well. Come and join us for an entertaining and informative meeting. Dan will have many of his pieces at the meeting for your viewing pleasure as well as jigs, sample pieces and tools that he uses in creating his wonderful bowls.

In the last few weeks the number of members volunteering to help with the "Design In Wood Show" at the San Diego County Fair June 8th to July 4th has dwindled to a mere trickle, leaving us with a severe shortage of help.

We started out needing to fill 308 time spots for the complete run of the Fair. We have filled 100 on the Gallery Floor and 92 in the Chair Shop. We need your help to fill these open slots, please consider assisting those already signed up by volunteering to work as a "Floor Ambassador" or to work in the "19th Century Chair Shop". Additional information about the duties can be found by following the directions at the bottom of this article (Instruction # 3). For each time slot you volunteer, you will receive two tickets for the fair.

If you can't help out during the fair you might want to consider helping with the set-up. Starting Monday May 21^{st} , 2007 @ 8:30 AM – 4:00 PM, through Thursday May 24^{th} we will be setting up the demonstration enclosures, installing lighting, platforms and walls.
