The Exhibition was well received by the public and was described on several occasions as being "stunning and beautiful." Again, it is extremely rewarding to have folks say that, "Design in Wood is their only reason to come to the Fair." This year was our third year to provide docent tours twice daily. Many folks who had done the tours in the past came back again. They noted that, "It is so much more meaningful to learn about the individual pieces and the judging process."

This year we almost completed set up in 4 days. With all the improvements we have made in our display, it is almost a "roll off the truck set up." Thanks to all the planning committee members for all their efforts to make things run so smooth. Thanks also to all the volunteers who helped with set up, manning the exhibit, and assisting with take down.

However there is always room for improvement. We are starting now to plan some fine tuning of the exhibit such as: the method for set up, the manner in which entries are handled, the judging process, the computerized volunteer set up process, and perhaps some redesign on the shadow boxes. Next year set up should go even better.

I will have the solid seat chairs at the meeting and we (the members) need to take a couple and finish them according to the directions provided (it is for a oil finish). The chairs are due back in September for distribution to the charities.

I want to thank several people: Ed Ducharme for cutting out the seats, Tom Henderson for cutting the crest rails, Bill's shop for mortising, tenoning and drilling front legs, the aprons and rungs and branding the back apron, Jerry Pendzick for cutting out the back legs, and Bob Stevenson for helping mortise the back legs and, of course, all the Shop volunteers for their handwork.

I have been trying for several years to upgrade our capabilities and skills. Sometimes we live up the our name of "Fine Woodworkers". Sometimes we don't! During this next year, I invite each of you to become more proficient in: Grain recognition

Measurement accuracy to 1/64th of an inch (at least)

Machine mark removal (a hand plane excels here)

Joinery accuracy and quality (joints are shaped after assembly—not before) Use of hand tools

Recognition of the difference between a round over, a chamfer, and breaking an edge; and finally, an appreciation for the individual parts of the furniture you are building and their unique relationship to each other.

I apologize for sharply yelling at some of you and ask for your forgiveness.

Please come back next year and do an even better job.


