## Woodworking Machinery--European vs. American Made

Have you ever wondered about the actual differences between "American" and "European" woodworking tools? What are these differences and why should we care? This month Erik Delaney of Felder Group USA Machines and Tools for Woodworking will provide an informative PowerPoint presentation that will compare and contrast these two types of equipment. Topics to be covered will be innovation, safety, capacity and ergonomic design considerations. Erik has been active in the woodworking equipment industry for more than12 years. In that time he has gained a full knowledge of European woodworking machines and their applications in the U.S. for both hobbyist and professional shops. He has made extensive visits to European equipment manufacturers to carefully analyze the levels of design and manufacturing quality that are part of the Euro machines.

As part of his time as a successful salesman he has been factory trained and is familiar with most of the major machine offerings. This experience has also given him a special insight on the differences between the classical American and European approach to accuracy, safety and productivity. With his experience he is able to shed light on some of the specific advantages of the European equipment and how its makers approach the American market.

Erik has worked with both the hobbyist and the professional woodworker and everyone in between. He has initiated design changes and modifications to make the European machines more suitable for the American marketplace.

This presentation promises to be very informative and interesting. Hope to see you there!

## **Polinsky Center Project**

Fifteen boys and girls in their temporary home at San Diego's Polinsky Children's Center spent an afternoon with three SDFWA members learning about wood and sanding and painting last month.

Al Devries, Carl Drake and I became instructors for the day, and fifteen happy kids became the owners of their personally decorated footstools, thanks to the cooperation of the Polinsky staff and the generosity of some great companies. Doug Qua gave the Association a lot of wonderful pine and parts for stools when his Quality-Craft company went out of business a few months ago, and we had assembled thirty or forty of them in my shop. We asked Ray Albright of Sharp hospital to find a good home for some of them, and those now help residents at the Sharp eldercare facility at Point Loma elevate their legs or climb into bed without assistance.

We still had a lot of stools left, and it seemed like a good idea to donate them to the Polinsky Center, which has received a lot of help from SDFWA over the years. The problem was that those of us who assembled them had no way to finish all of them. But there's an old saying, "If you have too many lemons, make lemonade," and that's what we did. I called Polinsky and they were delighted with the idea of our coming to the Center for an afternoon to work with kids to paint stools they would keep when they moved on to more permanent homes. Most had arrived at Polinsky without even a tooth brush.

We could have bought the supplies we needed, but being the resource/sponsor chairman gave me some great contacts. We wanted a clear sealer coat to make painting easier and faster for the kids. Sponsor Veejay Veljay of Shellac Finishes gave us enough shellac crystals to undercoat the stools. Next we needed enough brushes for all the painters. I headed for K-Surplus on Cleveland Avenue in National City, a place every San Diego woodworker should know about. I found a box of three dozen brushes and when I took them to the checkout counter I remarked that we would use them to teach Polinsky youngsters to paint. K-Surplus's owner then gave us not only the brushes, but a stack of 180 grit sandpaper and asked if we needed anything else. I knew we needed paint, but that would come from somewhere else.: our newest sponsor, Bayside Paint. Al and I took a couple of unpainted stools to Bayside, described our project and asked the manager for a really good price on a few cans of paint of various colors. He smiled and told us he had several cans of custom-mixed paint that had been rejected that he would give us. He added some color to give us bright blue and yellow for Charger colors, some bright red, and two shades of green. The colors were perfect for our painters!

The Polinsky kids and staff were overjoyed with the results, and have invited us to come often. This group was aged 7 to 10. We wanted to teach them to wash the brushes when they finished, but time ran out, and guess who washed out twenty brushes? The next time we go we're thinking about taking parts for birdhouses for older kids to assemble.
