SHOP TOUR

WORKSHOP OF ANDY MCPHERSON SATURDAY, APRIL 12TH, 9:00AM

In past 12 years that I have been working at Rockler Wood Working and Hardware, I have helped many of the members of the San Diego Fine Wood Workers Association with their projects. I now give you an opportunity to come visit with me at my workshop where I build all of my projects.

I started building the shop two years ago with the help of a couple friends who are also club members. The shop is 740 square feet and there is a separate bench room away from all the noise and dust of the large equipment, and that is where I do all my hand tool work and finishing. I have a complete line of both Jet and Delta machinery, and various hand power tools. I use a 3hp cyclone dust collector that is ducted to every one of the stationary tools and an overhead dust filter to keep the shop clean.

The shop is decorated in a 1940 American Railroad theme, including a passenger platform, roadbed and 45 feet of steel rail that was manufactured in 1880. The inside is decorated in much the same manner, old lanterns, photographs and metal signs and a potbelly wood stove to keep me warm in the winter.

So come out and join me for a morning of good conversation, camaraderie and all the donuts and coffee you can handle.

DESIGN IN WOOD VOLUNTEER REGISTRATION

It's that time again! You loved the fair last year, now you can help make it great this year. The volunteer schedule will be posted on the website <http://www.sdfwa.org> and you can pick your spot.

Just follow these easy steps and pick the Gallery Floor or the Chair Shop.

1. Log on the web site, the Home Page will come up.
2. On the right hand side of the page under "Coming Events" select "Volunteer To Work At Design in Wood".
3. The "Available Times for Design in Wood 2008 Volunteers page will come up.
4. Days and Dates are on the left side of the page. The Gallery Floor open times are shown in **white** on the left.
The Cabinet Shop open times are shown in **gray** on the right.
5. Make your selections, make note of the area, date, and time. Include second choices if you wish.
6. Scroll to the bottom of the page and select the highlighted Volunteer Coordinator "Ric Crumley".
7. Wait until the E-mail form appears, and fill out the form.
8. For "Subject" please use "DIW Volunteer". This will make it stand out from the rest of my E-mail.
9. Please include your name, phone number, the area you want to work in, dates and times you would like to volunteer for.
10. In the upper left corner of the form select "Send".

Entry Office "Extended Hours"

For those of you who have questions or would like assistance with entering on-line, note the following dates when the Entry Office will be open "Extended Customer Service Hours":

- 10am-2pm Saturday, April 19
- Open until 7pm on the following dates: Friday, April 25; Friday, May 2

Registration deadline (entry forms, fees):

Must be USPS Postmarked on or before Friday, May 2, or submitted on-line by 7:00pm (Pacific Time), May 2.

Delivery of exhibits:

Thursday, June 5, Noon – 8:00pm

Pick-up of exhibits:

Monday, July 7, Noon-8:00pm.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Who can enter? The Design in Wood Exhibition is open to all interested adult woodworkers. Wood projects must have been created by artists whose names appear on the entry form.

How many entries can I submit? A maximum of three entries, all classes combined, may be submitted per entrant. Works previously displayed in this Exhibition are not eligible.

Is there a fee? The processing fee is \$20.00 per wood project entered. Processing fees are non-refundable.

How do I enter? Registration is required. *Late entries will not be accepted.*

- **On-line registration:** Entries must be submitted at www.sdfair.com/entry by 7:00pm (Pacific Time) on Friday, May 2. On-line entries will receive an e-mail confirmation.
- **Mail in registration:** Completed forms and fees must be USPS postmarked on or before May 2. You will not receive a return receipt.
- **Hand delivered registration:** Completed forms must be delivered to the Entry Office, Del Mar Fairgrounds on or before May 2, 5:00pm.

What are the project requirements?

Projects that do not adhere to the requirements specified will be disallowed.

Projects, any portion of which was produced under the supervision of an instructor or those constructed from kits, are not eligible.

You must provide either color 4" x 6" photos or digital photos of your work, with no more than three views per entry. Each photo must show the entrant's name and item number to correspond to the entry form. Photos will not be returned. Photos of unassembled projects are not acceptable. Online entries submit photo as attachment 4 inches (400 pixels) x 6 inches (600 pixels) at 150 DPI and not to exceed 750KB in file size.

Entries that are unsuitable or require excessive display space may be disallowed by Fair Management.

Entries must be primarily made of wood.

Entries will be juried for acceptance into the show. Notification of your participation will be mailed prior to the delivery date.

When do I bring my exhibits? Notification of your participation will be mailed prior to the delivery date. See calendar for delivery date and times. Deliver exhibits to the Del Mar Fairgrounds Mission Tower Building. Access the Fairgrounds through the Solana Gate off of Via de la Valle. No

works will be received after this time. You must bring the projects described on the entry form. Claim checks will be issued when delivered.

Shipping Instructions: Small exhibits may be shipped, pre-paid, to arrive at the San Diego County Fair Entry Office between May 30 and June 4.

For return shipping of entries, a pre-paid return label from UPS **must** be included with your entry.

When do I pick-up my exhibits? All exhibits must be picked up on date and time specified in calendar. Exhibits may not be withdrawn before the close of the Fair. You must present your claim checks in order to pick-up your exhibits. If you are unable to come during specified time, please arrange for someone else to pick up your exhibits. That person must bring the claim checks and a signed, written authorization from you. Exhibits not picked up at this time become the property of the Fair and will be disposed of promptly.

How can I sell my work? All work on display will be considered for sale at the price indicated on the entry form. Work not for sale must be marked NFS on the entry form. Work not priced will be considered NFS. Sales inquiries will be collected and passed to the exhibitor when entries are picked up. No sales are allowed during the Fair. All sales will be the responsibility of the exhibitor.

What is the judging procedure? Judging panels will consist of woodworkers and professionals in the industry. The following judging criteria will be used for all classes: Design Integrity; Understanding and Use of Materials; Use of Form and Color; Overall Craftsmanship; and Appearance and Quality of Finish. All selected entries and award winning works will be displayed during the run of the Fair. The decision of the judges is final.

What else do I need to know? No entry will be accepted where the exhibitor describes conditions under which he/she will exhibit. Neither the San Diego County Fair (22nd District Agricultural Association) or the San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association will be responsible for any loss or damage of any kind. The Local and State Rules apply to this department. Copies are available at sdfair.com/entry or contact the Entry Office.

March Membership Report

As of 10 March we have 1039 paid-up members plus 402 spouses. This includes 957 renewals and 82 new members both of which are ahead of last year at the same date. There are, of course, many who have not yet renewed for 2008 and who have received a reminder letter. There are 452 members who opted for getting the newsletters from our website. This gives a significant saving in printing and mailing costs, freeing up funds for our programs.

There were a number of membership cards that were mailed between 24 December and 12 January but never received by the addressees. This is an unusual event, never before experienced. A second mailing was made to provide the affected members with member cards. A few member cards were damaged by heat-sealing in plastic holders and were replaced. The cards are thermally printed, so that heat will turn them black. Warning notices are now included with all cards being mailed.
