July Program

Building the Nakashima Conoid Chair

You may have seen this chair at the Design In Wood Show at the 2010 San Diego County Fair. The Nakashima conoid chair has become an iconic piece of modern furniture that has many technical and engineering difficulties in reproducing. Mike Wells, of Tassajara Designs in Carlsbad recently got an order for a set of these and decided that the seat part would be an ideal project for his CNC machine, but the rest of the process uses many custom designed jigs and set ups that should be familiar to everyone. Mike has used his computer-based engineering background for design and machining solutions along with old-world craftsmanship to produce unique furniture and cabinetry. One of these chairs was in the Design in Wood Show and he has put together a wonderful photo essay on the process of building this chair from lumber layout to final finishing and will present it while discussing what went into setting up and building this chair. I doubt that many of you have CNC machines in your garage, but this show still highlights all of the construction steps to build this chair and will be essential to anyone contemplating to build one of these.
