SDFWA Membership Report for September 2008

We have 1447 members, including 255 new members and 1192 renewals. Of the 1450 members on 31 December 2007, 260 (17.9%) did not renew for 2008, including 84 of the 226 who joined in 2007. Our problem is retaining members, both old and new. The loss rate is greater for one-year members (37.1%) than for the longer term ones (14.4%). The loss of old members from death or infirmity is surely a small part of this latter group.

After nine years as Chairman, Len Wener will turn over the job to Sia McGown after the Seminar has ended. He plans to remain on the Membership Committee as a backup to Sia whenever needed. The voluminous membership files will be copied for her and the database will be transferred. It is clear that only one person can be authorized to make entries or changes in the database.
