#### WE NEED YOUR HELP

The Design in Wood Exhibition opens on June 3, 2016, and runs through July 4, 2016. In order to properly staff the exhibit, we desperately need more volunteers to walk the gallery floor and to help make chairs in the 19<sup>th</sup> Century workshop. Absolutely no experience or special skills are needed for either of these positions. Whatever you need to know will be taught to you when you show up for your shift. There are several advantages to donating some of your time:

- 1. On the gallery floor you will have an opportunity to examine the entries, rather than just walk through quickly and glance at them. Fielding questions from the public could draw your attention to details that you might otherwise have overlooked. (Don't worry about questions to which you don't know the answers. You can always ask one of the staff members who will be nearby).
- 2. Working in the chair shop allows you to work with hand tools that you might seldom use. (Don't worry if you don't know how, because you will be given a short lesson, and you will look like an expert to the public.)
- 3. For each shift, you will receive two fair tickets. Sign up for more than one shift and you might collect enough tickets for you, your family, your friends and neighbors. You will have to use one (1) ticket for yourself in order to enter the fairgrounds each time you come for your shift.
- 4. Sign up for closing shifts on the gallery floor and receive four (4) tickets per shift.
- 5. Volunteers can use an "employees only" gate and avoid the long lines at the main gate. Early entry to the fair allows you to visit some exhibits that are not yet open to the public.

Sign up online: Go to <a href="www.sdfwa.org">www.sdfwa.org</a> and under Design in Wood click on Volunteer Schedule to see what shifts are available. To volunteer for a shift, click on Volunteer Sign-Up. Then use your membership number and email address; log in and complete your sign-up. Note: This method of sign-up will be available only until 5:00pm on May 1, 2016. **Sign up in Person:** You can also volunteer by signing up at the General Meetings. Bring your calendar to the meeting, so you can coordinate your schedule.

## **Notes from the Webmaster**

Jeff Bratt, Webmaster Searching the SDFWA Website

A couple of things have quietly upgraded your ability to find things on the SDFWA website. One is that the built-in search functions now scans the information associated with the photographs in the Design in Wood award gallery. For example, if you use the built-in search box to look for Bill Churchill, you can now find all the photos listed from his entries in Design in Wood.

The other enhancement actually comes from Google and has been in place for some time, but I recently discovered how it helps searching our site. The previously mentioned site search box looks through everything on the site, including the PDF

files in our newsletter archive. However, I had recently added other PDF files from previous year's Design in Wood catalogs which were scanned images of the printed versions of the catalog. Such images are generally not searchable. I discovered that Google started automatically performing text recognition conversions on certain document types, including PDF files. So if you use Google to search the SDFWA site, it will now locate exhibitor names from the entire entry catalog (of the past years I have posted), not just the first-place award winners that we photograph.

These results will show up in any relevant Google search, but there are ways to tell Google to only search the SDFWA site. You can use the Google advanced search <a href="https://www.google.com/advanced search">https://www.google.com/advanced search</a> and fill in the site or domain box, or simply add the tag-site: sdfwa.org - to any Google search. For example a Google search for - Paul Schurch site:sdfwa.org - will return results not only from the Craftsman List and SDFWA newsletters mentioning his presentations and Fall Seminar, but also from the 2014 and 2011 Design in Wood Exhibition catalogs.

This will encourage me to add even more Design in Wood Exhibition catalogs for past years, and obtain copies of older SDFWA newsletters, which I understand were also scanned. Hopefully the scan quality is good enough to allow accurate character recognition — something I made sure of when scanning the Design in Wood Exhibition catalogs. webmaster@sdfwa.org

Report on the Brett Hesser Tour

On Saturday morning March 9th, we were privileged to tour Brett Hesser's shop. We had fair weather, and the attendance was large. Brett's woodworking credentials go back a long time. As a young man, attended Leeds Design Workshops, Easthampton, Mass., and was their voungest to graduate in 1988. This institution, opened in 1977 by David Powell and John Tierney, taught furniture making. Powell was trained in the Edward Barnsley workshop in England, famous for its connection to William Morris and the arts and crafts style, and studied under the likes of David Pye while at the Royal College of Art. Brett moved to San Diego at twenty years of age, and entered the woodworking field. In 1993, he opened his own shop, Hesser Handcrafted. Over the following years, he changed locations a couple of times; moving into his present shop one year ago. The new shop is both larger and dedicated to a new business model: custom veneering. Although his love for handcrafting furniture is undiminished, and he still practices it, his main business now comes from building veneer panels for clients.

This began in 2004, when his ability to create his own veneer panels attracted the attention of other craftsmen. They liked his work and asked him to build panels for them. This proved lucrative and he was happy for the work. His workload increased until he needed much more space; the new shop is 16,000 square feet and has six employees. With space for twenty employees, the shop is uncrowded with craftsmen, but packed with large, expensive specialty machines for creating veneer panels. There are thousands upon thousands of square feet of veneer in every variety of exotic wood you are ever likely to find. Brett's advice to his clients is to always use highly figured exotic wood. The expense of the pieces he creates is such that he sees no reason for using plain figured wood on a project.

Brett explained the uses of his machines and demonstrated quite a few of them. While few, if any of us, will ever own something as large and expensive, Brett also spoke of how the small shop does the work with hand tools. He also discussed how to create the illusion of solid wood with veneer, such as solid wood edges, or veneering over curved mdf. He passed around samples of this technique which were eye opening, while encouraging us to give a lot of thought to achieving interesting results in our own work. Of course, carving can't be done on a veneer product, but most other design effects can be with enough effort.

Brett also mentioned when and why he uses mdf, particle board, or plywood for the core of his panels. Factors range from fire codes, screw holding ability, weight, and of course, what the client specifies. Given his own choice, he opts for mdf due to its flatness, Doorbond 200 adhesive for its effectiveness, and Sherwin Williams conversion varnish for its sprayability and long life. Trial and error have taught him these, and many other lessons, over a lifetime of woodworking. That said, he never stops learning new things in his field.
