sign up, but after May 8<sup>th,</sup> you will need to pick up your tickets at will call. There are still a few slots left in the chair shop, but we really need floor walker slots filled. Please consider signing up for a shift or two. Remember that this is your show. It has become the largest show of its kind in the country. We need your help to keep it as the best show possible.

# Help us make DIW a big success!

The Design in Wood Exhibition opens on June 2<sup>nd</sup> and runs through July 4<sup>th</sup>. In order to properly staff the exhibit, we need volunteers to walk the gallery floor and to help make chairs in the 19th Century workshop. Absolutely no experience or special skills are needed for either of these positions. Whatever you need to know will be taught to you when you show up for your shift. There are several advantages to donating some of your time:

- 1. On the gallery floor you will have an opportunity to examine the entries, rather than just walk through quickly and glance at them. Fielding questions from the public could draw your attention to details that you might otherwise have overlooked. (Don't worry about questions to which you don't know the answers. You can always ask one of the staff members who will be nearby).
- 2. Working in the chair shop allows you to work with hand tools that you might seldom use. (Don't worry if you don't know how, because you will be given a short lesson, and you will look like an expert to the public.)
- 3. For each shift, you will receive two fair tickets. Sign up for more than one shift and you might collect enough tickets for you, your family, your friends and neighbors. You must use one (1) ticket for yourself to enter the fairgrounds each time you come for your shift.
- 4. Sign up for closing shifts on the gallery floor and receive four (4) tickets per shift.


# Member Shop Project






Andy Rae has been working wood for over three decades, designing and building furniture as well as teaching and writing about the craft. His work has been featured in galleries, museums, and in the homes of appreciative clients around the world. Andy has authored over 100 articles for woodworking publications such as Fine Woodworking, American Woodworker, and Woodcraft Magazine. He has authored five books, including Furniture and Cabinet Construction (2001, Taunton Press) and Working with



Wood (2005, Taunton Press). Andy worked with George Nakashima and Frank Klausz before founding his own woodworking business. He has been awarded a New Jersey Council of the Arts Fellowship for his furniture designs. Rae spent six

years on staff with American Woodworker magazine when it was owned by Rodale Press. As senior editor, he published articles by woodworking enthusiasts and penned numerous bylines. He wrote his first woodworking book in 2001 (Furniture and Cabinet Construction, Taunton Press) and has since authored four more, including Working with Wood (2005, Taunton Press). In addition to making furniture and writing about it, Rae teaches regularly at schools and clubs. Probably his biggest thrill (besides woodworking) is tooling around the mountains of Western North Carolina on a motorcycle, often with a sidecar attached and kid or two-and sometimes a tongue-wagging dog-in tow. He currently works in Asheville, North Carolina, making furniture as well as teaching and writing about woodworking.





Bob Stevenson's Shop Tour Report

The weather was wonderful for the Bob Stevenson shop tour this past April 29th, which was fortunate as it was well attended. Bob began by inviting the attendees into his shop, where he gave a little talk about his life. Bob spoke about his early work experience, his service in the navy, and how became a woodworker. He runs a one-man shop which turns out museum quality furniture reproductions, and other commissioned furniture.

Bob prefers to use hand tools for most operations. He inherited many planes and tools from ancestors on both sides of his family. His power tools are basic, among which is his Powermatic 66 table saw. He often uses a 7" blade by Tenyru, which is only 1/16" thick, to slice inlay stock. This saves expensive lumber, holly for example, with its thin kerf. Bob also has other power tools often used in preparing rough lumber for working with hand tools.

Bob also spoke about his extensive inventory of lumber: old-growth English white oak, eastern white pine (his favorite secondary wood), rare Cuban mahogany, among others. He also has a large supply of red maple, and split red oak logs, which he keeps under water and uses for chair building. He harvested this lumber from family owned property in New Hampshire.

Outside his shop, Bob had a work table set up where he demonstrated some of the techniques he used in creating a Federal Secretary with tamboor doors. Bob was able to obtain plans for this case by Robert Millard.





Bob Millard used a technique of inlaying the bell flower swags in veneer and then applying the inlaid veneer onto the strips. Bob showed us his method of making the strips from solid lumber, and then inlaying directly onto them; thus avoiding the use of veneer in the process

Bob had pieces of stock clamped together on the work table. He then inlayed the bell flowers into the clamped up strips. This was done using a sweep with square corners; not a



the holly inlay pieces.

sweep with rounded corners one uses for carving. The depth of cut is 1/16" for Next, the holly bell flowers are cut from the holly stock using the same tool.



The bell flower pieces were the inlaid into the strips.





The edges of the strips are then beaded with a beading tool.





The beaded strips which make up the tamboor door face are then glued to a canvas backing.
