By the time you get this it will be past the time to have your tickets mailed, but you can still volunteer and pick up your tickets at will call. We need your help, especially on the 4PM to 7PM and 7PM to 10PM floor walking shifts. At this time, we only have 6 slots for the 4PM to 7PM shift out of 50 slots needed. We only have a few spots left for the chair shop.

Volunteers from our membership are needed to walk the floor and work in the chair shop. NO experience is necessary to volunteer, and volunteering is very rewarding. Go to http://www.sdfwa.org/volunteerduties/ for detailed information, schedule and signup instructions. Help is needed with set up starting Monday, May 14 at the fairgrounds Mission Tower building. Enter the Solana gate and park near the building. Bring a screw gun, if you have one. There is a lot to do. We have Marines to do the heavy lifting. In addition to free fair tickets; enjoy coffee, juice and donuts in the morning; a great lunch and refreshments throughout the day. Come in and find any of our staff (those are the ones with employee badges) and they will get you signed up and put you to work. If you have problems, seek me out and I will find something for you to do.

# 2018 Fall Seminar Garrett Hack

September 7, 8, 9, 2018

Cases are a fundamental furniture form, encompassing everything from chests of drawers to cabinets, armoires to sideboards. They require the basics of strong case


construction along with a whole range of useful furniture making skills to build drawers, doors, shelves, moldings and practical and attractive details.



Garrett will construct a small hanging cabinet to illustrate the basics of casework and how his case design is adaptable to much more complex pieces. He will cover such topics as choosing appropriate materials, how to build with solid wood and allow for wood movement, building strong cases with interesting corners and details, the advantages of a face frame, solid case backs, and how to support drawers and maybe include a secret compartment or two.

Our cabinet will have a door, so Garrett will make one, and explain how to hang it with butt hinges. And for practical reasons and the visual interest they add, we need some moldings, which he will make with molding planes. Throughout the process, Garrett will discuss efficient ways of working that balance the speed of machines with the accuracy and superior finish of hand tools.

Garrett Hack is an internationally known furnituremaker, educator, writer, and farmer from Thetford, Vermont. A furniture maker of more than 42 years, he has created his own aesthetic, with designs that push his skills to the next level. He's also an in-demand woodworking instructor, teaching classes in Germany, England, Austria, Italy, Spain, Canada, Australia, and Japan. Hack has a great love of hand tools of all shapes and sizes and uses them to great effect in everything he builds, sculpting delicate details by eye. He is the author of The Handplane Book (Taunton Press, 1997) and Classic Hand Tools (Taunton Press, 1999), a contributing editor at Fine Woodworking magazine (29 years), and former chairman of the New Hampshire Furniture Masters.

# The Five Hundred Dollar Toilet Paper Holder

Pacemaker, a client otherwise known as Bill Stemholz, was the victim of heart disease caused by smoking three packs a day, a diet high in fat, a high stress job in the computer industry and a gorgeous second wife who complained bitterly about all aspects of the remodel. Bill Stemholz's heart told him, in no uncertain terms, that it was tired of the whole damn business, so his doctors put in a pacemaker whose job it was to flog the overworked organ whenever it showed signs of quitting. After that, Bill had two great fears. One was that his wife would get a splinter or trip on an electrical cord and yell at him, causing his heart to do those uncomfortable flip flops which always scared the hell out of him. The other was that someone would turn on a microwave oven when he was in the vicinity and the pacemaker would explode or melt or do whatever microwaved pacemakers did. His wife insisted on a built-in microwave over the oven and pooh-poohed his worries. Pacemaker wondered if his life insurance had anything to do with her decision.

This surgery, in the middle of the construction project, sparked considerable interest among the workmen who were all deeply concerned. Primarily, they were concerned about who would pay if the old guy died. At lunch there were deep, extended conversations about probate law and the contractual obligations of the dead. Took and Larry, who gave everyone nicknames, began calling him Pacemaker and it was Pacemakers's bright idea that started the toilet paper holder fiasco.

Took was building the vanities in the bathrooms. When he was in the freshly dry walled master bathroom going over designs and discussing price, Pacemaker asked him if he would build a simple little oak toilet paper holder that was flush with the wall. Took, ever anxious to make a sale, offered to throw one in for free, thinking it would be a piece of cake and could be made simply from scrap wood. The first one was fairly simple. Six weeks later, Took got a call from Pacemaker's irate wife who said she couldn't slide a roll of paper onto the dowel because the hole in the roll of paper was too small or the dowel was too big. That is when Took found out that holes in rolls of toilet paper are not standardized. There is no committee whose job it is to make uniform holes in paper products. There was no governmental agency whose purpose included standardization of toilet paper rolls. The Uniform Building Code had no section

devoted to dispensers of toilet paper products.

This revelation affected Took deeply. How many other products, he worried, had similar defects? How much of his trust in standardization was built on a foundation of sand? If something so simple as the size of a hole in toilet paper was ignored, what in life could be trusted? Were shoe sizes the same everywhere? Were medium shirts really medium? Who decided what medium was in the first place? Who was in charge of rulers and tape measures? Who decided how strong the steel in a circular saw blade had to be so it didn't explode driving shards of steel into his brain when he flipped on the switch and it began to revolve at 3500 rpm? Wasn't there a bureau somewhere in Washington that handled these matters? Took's worries ran deep.

When Took went to look at the paper holder, he had to acknowledge the problem. He tried halfheartedly and unsuccessfully to convert Pacemaker's wife to a new brand of toilet paper, but she refused his offer of a full case of an ecologically considerate brand. He sighed and agreed to replace the holder. As he was trying to remove it in the cramped area by the toilet, his pry bar slipped and he gouged a hole in the new wallpaper. Pacemaker's wife reacted violently. She screamed and her voice rose to new heights. She babbled about last straws, flaky subs and goddamn contractors and then broke into tears. Pacemaker, one hand over his heart, led her away and made her take two valium tablets.
