# January Program: Joinery; with Taeho Kwon



Taeho Kwon – (Winner of the Master woodworkers' trophy from last year's Design-In-Wood), will give a presentation on what is Joinery; is it stronger than screws or nails and how the joinery can help the lifespan of the project. Taeho studied interior design at East Carolina University, but then traveled to Korea and attended the

School of Traditional Korean Architecture where he learned how to make Buddhist Temples and King's Palace and built traditional Korean houses. Many of these techniques can be seen in his lamp from last year's DIW show. Taeho also teaches at the William Ng School of Fine Woodworking in Anaheim, Ca.

# Possible February Shop Tour

The United States is rich with wood varieties. And San Diego County has a rich and more diverse urban forest than anywhere in the US. Many of us in SDFWA have used local wood to build projects for the Del Mar Fair. Some of the more desirable of the local woods are: Torrey Pine, Camphor, Twisted Juniper, several varieties of Auricaria (Hoop Pine, monkey puzzle, Norfolk Island Pine), Eucalyptus (Iron Bark and Red Gum are best), and so much more.

That is why I suggested to Dale Stauffer that he go up to Fallbrook with me next Sunday to check out Brian Bishop's wood cutting operation, so we can schedule a shop tour in February. Brian owns Bishop's Tree Service, and is upping his game of removal and trimming to include Urban Lumber. Weekends finds him slicing lumber with his Wood Mizer band sawmill. Four or five trucks towing chippers are parked in the upper lot. Brian can be found driving a tractor that picks up logs and positions them for the mill.

There are stacks of carefully stickered lumber in the lower third of the operation. The address is 3309 Olive Hill Dr., in Fallbrook. Brian cares for 10 acres and uses several for the lumber. Check out the website for Bishop Tree Service, (bishopstreeservice.net). There are some views of the area on the site.

The best thing about getting your lumber from Brian is that he is passionate about his work. He is insatiably curious about species - how to mill them, how to cure them and what they are best suited for. I hope we can schedule the tour in February. A worthwhile visit.


This little guy really likes his!

# 2019 Design In Wood Exhibition

Time to start working on your entry for the 2019 Design In Wood exhibition. Remember, there are more chances to win for SDFWA members. Entries close April 26<sup>th</sup> this year, so it's time to get started, if you haven't already. We now have 26 separate entry classes. Each class has 1<sup>ST</sup>, 2<sup>ND</sup>, 3<sup>RD</sup> and 4<sup>TH</sup> cash awards. In addition, Honorable Mentions are also awarded in each class at the discretion of the judges. These are State awards. Each class is judged by a well-known expert in their field. Also, we have secured donated awards from our many corporate and local sponsors which greatly increases the number of awards. We have over \$20,000 in cash and merchandise awarded each year. We look forward to making our 38<sup>th</sup> year the best. Last year's attendance provided the opportunity for over one and a half million fairgoers to see our exhibit.

This year's theme is "San Diego County Fair, Ozsome!" inspired by L. Frank Baum's classic tale, "The Wonderful Wizard of Oz." I expect to see some "Oz-some" theme entries.

All entries are entered online and will be available on the fair's website beginning in mid-February at <u>www.SDFAIR.com</u>. The entry deadline is April 26<sup>th</sup>. There is plenty of help with entries from the entry office at the fair.

The exhibit opens on Friday, May 31st at 4pm and runs through July 4<sup>th</sup>. The fair is closed all Mondays and Tuesdays in June. Other important dates are:

## Volunteering at Design In Wood

What sets our show apart from others are <u>all of you</u>. We constantly hear Design In Wood is the favorite "must-see" exhibit at the fair. It is largely because SDFWA woodworking members are there to interact with the public, answering woodworking questions and supplying a great experience for fairgoers. Most questions from the public are easy to answer and we have plenty of knowledgeable people to help if needed. We really need your help, so please plan on volunteering. Remember the DIW show is "your show" and one to be proud of. It was the main reason SDFWA was established and (from our bylaws), the purpose of SDFWA "is dedicated to the education, promotion, and execution of the principles of fine woodworking to the public." The DIW show is our main venue for achieving that goal.

NO experience is necessary to volunteer,

and volunteering is very rewarding!

We need members to "walk the floor" to help educate the public about woodworking and protect the exhibits. A shift is three hours although you do not have to be on your feet the entire time. We encourage you to take a break if you need to. We have a break room with soda, coffee and snacks. <u>You receive two tickets for each shift or four tickets for each closing shift</u> (last shift in the evening). It is not necessary to be a "master" woodworker to answer questions from the public. Even "beginning" woodworkers will know more than 99% of the public. Most questions are easy to answer, and we have plenty of help if needed. The number 1 question every year? "Where is the bathroom?"

We also need members to work in the chair shop, building children's chairs for charity. A shift is two hours. <u>You receive two tickets for each shift</u>. Learn some new hand tool woodworking skills from master craftsmen. The chairs we build by hand are donated to needy children's organizations around San Diego. They are very much in high demand. Over the years we have delivered over 1,700 chairs to many worthwhile non-profit organizations. <u>Two tickets will be given for each floor-walking shift or chair-shop shift</u>. Four tickets are given to those who sign up for the last floor-walking <u>shift</u>. Volunteer for several shifts and you can receive enough tickets for your family and friends.

### <u>Setup</u>

We need help with set up starting on Monday, May 13. In addition to free fair tickets, enjoy coffee, juice and donuts in the morning, lunch is provided with soda and water throughout the day. Up to 4 tickets will be given to those who help with setup (varies depending on amount of time helping).

# <u>Remember, sign up for a shift and get two (2) free tickets to the Fair.</u> Sign up for several shifts and get enough tickets for your family and friends also.

## **COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS:**

- The Local and State Rules apply to this department, available at sdfair.com/entry. No entry will be accepted should the exhibitor describe conditions under which they will exhibit. Neither the San Diego County Fair (22nd District Agricultural Association) nor the San Diego Fine Woodworkers Association will be responsible for loss or damage of any kind. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to purchase insurance, if deemed necessary.
- 2. Eligibility: Open to all interested woodworkers age 18 and over.
- 3. Works previously displayed in this exhibition are not eligible. Entries that do not adhere to the requirements specified will be disallowed.
- 4. Entries must be made primarily of wood and must have been created by the artist whose name appears on the entry registration. Entries, any portion of which were produced under the supervision of an instructor or those constructed from kits, are not eligible.
- 5. Limit: Three (3) entries, all classes combined per entrant.
- 6. Processing Fee: \$20.00 per entry entered.
- 7. All entries are submitted online. Photos must be submitted with each entry.
- 8. Enter your information carefully and proofread your name and title of the project for punctuation, capitalization and spelling to ensure accuracy on exhibit labels.
- 9. Photos of unassembled entries are not acceptable.
- **10.** Entries that are unsuitable or require excessive display space may be disallowed by Fair Management. Entries will be juried for acceptance into the show.
- 11. Entries must be the same as submitted in the online entry process. Substitutions will not be accepted.
- Sale of work: All work on display will be considered for sale at the price indicated during entry registration. Work not for sale must be marked NFS during entry registration. Work not priced will be considered NFS. Sales inquiries will be collected and passed to the exhibitor when entries are picked up. No sales are allowed at the Fair. All sales will be the responsibility of the exhibitor.
- Judging procedure: Judging panels will consist of master woodworkers and industry professionals for each class. Judging criteria for all classes: Design Integrity, Understanding and Use of Materials, Use of Form and Color, Overall Craftsmanship, and Appearance and Quality of Finish. Pre-jurying by judges will be done initially from digital images to determine acceptability and proper class assignment. Judges, per their discretion, may reassign entries to the proper class. All selected entries and award winning works will be displayed during the run of the Fair. The decision of the judges is final.
- **Delivery/Shipping:** Deliver entries to the Del Mar Fairgrounds Mission Tower Building. (See page 1 for dates) Access the Fairgrounds through the Solana Gate from Via de la Valle. No works will be received after this time. Claim checks will be issued when delivered. Small works may be shipped, pre-paid, to arrive at the San Diego County Fair. Review calendar for delivery dates for hand-delivery or shipped. No Entries will be accepted before this date for hand-delivery. The Entry Office must receive a notification via email at entry@sdfair.com with the estimated delivery date of the accepted entry(s).
