

Hand Tool Joinery

The education program at SDFWA has grown in the last couple of years and many of our classes are directed at the new woodworkers. For some time we have noticed that there are many woodworkers who would like to incorporate hand tools into their work but have experienced frustration in learning how to use and maintain hand tools.



Responding to this need we have introduced three new hand tool classes: <u>Hand Tool</u> <u>Sharpening</u>, <u>Measuring and Marking</u> have been very well received. Our newest class, <u>Hand Tool Joinery</u>, was a roaring success as you will see below.

The class was taught by Paul Duffield and David Weissman and we were very ably assisted by Mike Reidy.

The class has just four students and two instructors, as well as a TA, which allows for close individual coaching in both skills and technique.

Our very enthusiastic group learned how to set up and use bench planes, chisels and Japanese pull saws in the early part of the class, after which they learned how to do several types of lap joint and two kinds of mortise and tenon. On the fifth week of class they cut and fitted dovetails, as you can see in the photo. The last week was reserved for students to learn how to make a shop tool using two kinds of wood.

We had such a good time teaching this class that we are going to do another one very soon! We will be starting the next session on Tuesday April 5. Enrollment is available now. I hope to see you there.

The Fair is Back

Ticket sales start next month for 'Heroes'-themed San Diego County Fair, which takes place June 8 to July 4

The San Diego County Fair will return to its full schedule this year with the theme "Heroes," which it was supposed to be in 2020. (U-T file) The San Diego County Fair will return this year from June 8 to July 4 for the first time since the COVID-19 pandemic started, using the "Heroes" theme that was originally slated for 2020.

Ticket sales will start on April 2, the board of directors that runs the state-owned venue announced during its March 8 meeting. Last year, the Del Mar Fairgrounds hosted Home Grown Fun, a scaled-down version of the fair. The usual fair was canceled in 2020 because of public health restrictions, along with almost all other events at the fairgrounds.

But this year will include the usual lineup of attractions and events. "We are going to be returning to the festivals in the fair," said Frederick Schenk, vice president of the fair board.

Some of the highlights include Toast of the Coast Wine Festival on June 11, the San Diego International Beer Festival on June 16-17, Asian Festival on June 18 and Gospel Festival on June 25.

"It will also be a tribute to the real life superheroes who walk among us every day," Schenk said.

The fair will be open every day except Mondays and Tuesdays. Some of the other events will include competitions in woodworking, spirits and cocktails, and floral design.

HomeGrownFun concluded last summer after drawing about 272,000 people, providing a financial boost to the fairgrounds and surrounding cities and businesses. Fair board members said they are looking forward to continuing the return to normal operations and events.

"This will really be a fair to remember," Schenk said. Organizers are still looking for sponsors, exhibitors, vendors and performers for the monthlong fair.
